Capital Letters



Beginning of the sentence:	The toy is soft.
Days of the week:	Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday
Name of people and places:	Harry lives in England.
Personal pronoun 'I':	I am happy.

Using 'and'

Joining words together using 'and'.
The dog was **brown** and **fluffy**.
'and' joins the two words.

Joining clauses together using 'and'.
We saw a brown dog and **it chased a black cat**.
'and' joins the two equal clauses that make sense on their own.

Prefixes / Suffixes

un: unkind, untie

s: dogs, cats
es: wishes, flashes

ing: helping
ed: helped
er: helper

Vocabulary

Letter	One of the characters that make the alphabet.
Word	Letters put together that create meaning.
Capital letter	Upper case letter used at the start of a sentence and for names of people and places.
Singular	One of.
Plural	More than one.
Sentence	Combination of words.
Punctuation	Used to clarify sentences.
Full stop	Placed at the end of a sentence.
Question mark	Place at the end of a sentence to indicate a question.
Exclamation mark	Used to express feeling.
