SCIENCE

- The children will compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.
- They will explore different habitats and learn the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.
- They will describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals through a simple food chain.
- They will learn about the basic needs of animals and humans, offspring and the importance of exercise and diet and hygiene.

ENGLISH

- Our English work will include several high-quality texts and some will link to our topic.
- Children will have opportunities to develop their writing stamina and understanding of new vocabulary to use in their writing. We will focusing on writing narratives, recounts, explanation, information and character descriptions.
- The children will learn how to use suffixes, contractions, conjunctions, retrieving their knowledge of how to use verbs and adjectives to improve their writing.

COMPUTING

- The children will be creating and debugging programs, and using logical reasoning to make predictions.
- We will be collecting data in tally charts and using attributes to organise and present data on a computer.

HISTORY

- We will be learning about how people use their voice to make change.
- · We will be learning about some influential people including Rosa Parks, Malala Yousafzai and Alice Hawkins.
- The children will be learning about people's rights.
