


Induction: pre-school links

Induction: paperwork



- Office staff are here tonight to help you complete all the paperwork.
 Please check with them.
- ALL children are entitled to Universal Infant School Meals in Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2.
- Some families are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM), this is different to Universal Free School Meals. FSM offers a lot more benefits to eligible parents. All the information is on the school website (New Starters 2024-2025).
- Please see email from office regarding medical forms.
- NOTE: children cannot be left at school without essential medication (e.g. epipens, inhalers). Please make sure we have these in school by their induction day and they are within date.

- Breakfast (toast or cereal) from 7.45am until 8:30am. Snack during after-care.



We will invite you to a series of information sessions throughout the year to learn more about how we learn in Foundation Stage.

Foundation Stage: curriculum



We spend time getting to know your children and complete a national baseline assessment at the start of the year. Our focus is supporting your children to settle into school so they feel happy and secure and subsequently ready to learn.



Foundation Stage: special educational needs (SEN)



- All children are different and reach different milestones at different points. Many children will have temporary difficulties with learning at some point.
- Special educational needs describes difficulties that make it harder for a child to learn than most children of their age. Children with SEN are likely to need extra or different help to learn.
- If you have any worries or concerns about your child at any point during their time at Brocks Hill contact your class teacher.
- Early intervention is the most effective!
- We follow the special educational needs code of practice and have all SEN policies on our school website.

Foundation Stage: classes



- 2 classes Red class and Blue class.
- 30 children in each.
- We work in a base but have separate quiet rooms and cloakrooms.
- Children will get to know all the adults who work across Foundation Stage.

Foundation Stage: the school day




- Doors open 8:55am for a 9am start.
- Lunch 11:30 (approximately).
- End of the day: 3:15pm.
- Red class and Blue class have separate entrances/exits. We will show you these at Stay and Play/September induction days.





Attendance & start times

- Attendance really matters!
- Every child has a right to an education! Parents and teachers share responsibility
 to make sure that children can fully participate in their education through
 excellent attendance and punctuality.
- Being on time matters! Phonics review starts by 9:05, intervention groups start at 9. If your child is late, they will miss something... and staff will have to stop what they are doing with other children to settle your child in.
- Please support us by making sure your child:
 - Comes to school every day.
 - Comes on time.
 - ❖ Is ready to learn (correct uniform & equipment).



Foundation Stage: lunch



- All children in FS and KS1 are entitled to a free school meal.
- Parents can choose for their child to have a healthy packed lunch if preferred.

Medical diets:

- Medical diets (e.g. diabetes, coeliac, allergies) can be accommodated if a diagnosis letter from a doctor is provided.
- To register for a medical diet, go to the Medical Diet Portal:
 https://www.leicestershire.gov.uk/education-and-children/schools-colleges-and-academies/school-food
- Deadline for new starters: 21st June 2024. Any forms received after this date will be processed but with no guarantee that a medical diet will be produced in time for the start of the Autumn Term.
- Once a diet has been created this will be automatically emailed to school, parent/guardian, and the school kitchen.
- **'Complicated diets'** will take longer to produce children can bring a packed lunch in the meantime.



Foundation Stage: uniform



School Uniform:

- Black shoes
- Grey trousers, skirt or dress.
- Green checked school dress in the summer or grey school shorts.
- White polo shirt, shirt or blouse
- · Bottle green sweatshirt or cardigan.















P.E Kit:

- Black jogging bottoms
- White T-shirt (round neck)
- Black sweatshirt or zip up
- Trainers
- Children will come in P.E. kit on P.E. days (once a week),

Foundation Stage: equipment



- Book bag. No backpacks, thank you.
- Water bottle. Water only please! Please don't put these in bookbags.
- Waterproof coat. Lots of our learning is outside so we go out whatever the weather!
- Wellingtons (optional).
- Spare school clothes are useful. These can be in a draw string bag that stays on their peg.

The Early years Foundation Stage is all about exploring, investigating and enjoying learning through play.

We want all children to be thoroughly involved and engaged in their learning — not too worried about getting a bit mucky!






Foundation Stage: Tapestry









- Free fruit every day.
- Free milk until children turn 5. Order with CoolMilk after your child turns 5.
- Soon you will get a reading folder, book and reading record that needs to be signed and returned each week.







School Nursing Service

- Once your child is at school the School Nursing Service takes over from your Health Visitor.

- School newsletter and website







- Conversation doesn't have to be in English!


Two languages are better than one!


- Head start in school learning a new language is mandatory.

Getting Ready for School

- Can your child zip their own coat and put shoes on and off by themselves?
- Can your child use a knife and fork? Scrape their plate when they have finished?
- Can your child independently go to the toilet?
- Can your child share and take turns?
- Can your child remain focused on an activity for a short period of time? e.g. completing a jigsaw, listening to stories, playing games.
- Can your child recognize their name?
- Look at ideas in '50 things to do before you start school'.
