


## **EVERYDAY ESSENTIALS**

Requests for term time holidays will be rejected and period of absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Fine may be issued.



### MULTIPLICATION CHECK

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools in the 2021/22 academic year.

The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.

## HOME LEARNING

#### Our expectations

- Reading and/or talking about their reading to an adult for at least 20 minutes, 5 times a week. Different year groups will have different routines regarding reading. Please look out for guidance from their year group.
- Learning spelling patterns linked to age-related expectations every week.
- Reciting multiplication tables to increase their fluency so that they can be applied in other areas of maths and problem solving.
- Teachers may also direct pupils to additional work to support their work in class if this is felt necessary.
- Support work is always available on the VLE. Children can choose if they wish to use this to consolidate or review their learning.
- Complete activities from home learning log.

## JUNIOR BOOK CLUB

- ✓ 2 weeks per book.
- The children should read regularly every day by spreading out the reading over the 2 week period.
- Children can share their reading with a family member or read on their own.
- Each child will have a reading homework book to plan a 2 minute talk about what they have read that week.
- Children must bring in their homework book with their planned talk in <u>every</u> <u>Monday.</u>
- Think about: What sort of story is it? Who are the main characters? Who is your favourite character? What is your favourite part of the story? What is your opinion on the story? Would you recommend it?

### HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD IN YEAR 4

- Regularly discuss with your child about what they have been learning.
- Visit the library and encourage a love of reading.
- Encourage your child to read daily and read to them.
- ✓ Encourage them to be physically active.
- ✓ Reinforce the 6Rs and encourage those effective characteristics for learning.
