

Celebrate!

We have recently had notification that Brocks Hill has yet again performed exceptionally well in last years end of year SATs and phonics check.

- The proportion of pupils meeting the phonics expected standard in Year 1 was significantly above national and in the highest 20% of all schools in 2022
- Key stage 1 attainment of the expected standard in mathematics was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard in writing was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard in reading was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.
- Key stage 2 progress and attainment in mathematics was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard in the English grammar, punctuation and spelling test and the high standard in the English grammar, punctuation and spelling test was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard in science was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022

We are so proud of all the pupils involved in these assessments and know that these results don't just happen. All teachers at Brocks Hill have consistently gone above and beyond in helping every child achieve their potential.
